RESPONSIBILITIES:

Reporting to the Superintendent of Education and working with various Board and school personnel, the SAT will provide leadership, direction and support to the newly created Multi-Disciplinary Team. The SAT will liaise with Resource Teachers and Principals in matters relating to special education program delivery, services, intervention strategies and the development of IEPs for both students identified by the IPRC and those who are not using the Ministry Policy Program memorandum and other legislation as the foundation for services. This includes participation in case conference, IPRCs and other meetings as necessary. He/she will also be required to work in conjunction with Board-contracted Psychologists to complete psychoeducational assessments across the district. Under the direction of the Superintendent of Education and with the other SAT for Special Education, he/she will complete the necessary ministry reports for SEA, SIP, IEPs and other initiatives as required, the annual Special Education Plan and participate in monthly SEAC meetings.

This position is based in Timmins and will require travel throughout the Board.

MANDATORY QUALIFICATIONS:

- Applicants must possess the qualifications in accordance with the Education Act and the pertinent Regulations, including a specialist qualification in Special Education.
- Five (5) years teaching experience.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Excellent communication, interpersonal, and organizational skills;
- Experience in the use and scoring of a variety of psychoeducational assessment tools;
- Strong community connections and knowledge of community organizations and resources;
- Keen understanding of of the legislation governing special education in the province of Ontario and the Ontario curriculum;
- Significant commitment to Catholic education and promotion of the Catholic faith;
- Awareness of Indigenous traditions and perspectives;

The Applicant must possess a valid driver's license as travel is required.
