OCSTA Responds to School Closure Extension to May 4 and Provincial Learn at Home Strategy

March 31, 2020

As the Association representing the interests of Ontario's publicly funded Catholic school boards, the Ontario Catholic School Trustees' Association (OCSTA) welcomes the government's timely announcement today of a collaborative framework to support the continuity of learning for students as the school closure period extends to May 4.

By recognizing the experience of the education sector and the inherent resources within our communities we can continue to develop solutions to address the varying technological, sociological and mental health needs associated with a virtual learning environment.
