The launching of the Year of Faith marked the 50th anniversary of the beginning of the Second Vatican Council and the 20th anniversary of the publication of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Throughout this upcoming year we will find ways in our school and parish (and hopefully your home) to celebrate the gift of our Catholic Faith, learn more about it and deepen in our personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

The Parish will be hosting a number of workshops and programs to help you grow in your faith and become a more active member of our Church Family.



UPCOMING SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION PROGRAMS

One of the great gifts that Jesus left to the early Church and by extension to us are the sacraments. The sacraments are special gifts, given by Jesus, to help us live holy and happy lives. They help us draw closer to God and lead more fulfilling and enriching lives.

Just as there are various stages that we journey through life, so too there are various stages that we journey in our sacramental lives. The school, parish, and home play a special role in the sacramental journey of your child(ren).



BAPTISM is the first of the sacraments of the Church. In and through the Sacrament of Baptism, we are washed clean of original sin, made members of God's Family, and the

doorway through which the other sacraments are received.

We will be offering a preparation course for parents who wish to have their child baptized in the Catholic Faith. Preparation consists of three evening sessions spread over a three week period of time. The next session will begin on **Monday, September 16th at 7:00 P.M.** and parents should register, by calling the Parish Office (705-647-5035), as soon as possible.

Children who wish to receive the other sacraments of the Catholic Church must be baptized first. As well, in the future if they wish to be a godparent or have their children, one day attend a Catholic school, they must be baptized beforehand.

RECONCILIATION is the privileged means for followers of Jesus to receive the gift of forgiveness and healing from their sins.

Children in grade three and up are invited to prepare for the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the fall.

Preparation consists of three parent meetings, an at home parent-child workbook, participation in our weekly children's program at Saturday Evening Mass, and a retreat afternoon for candidates. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is received during the Advent Season.

All parents who wish to have their child make their First Reconciliation this year must attend an important parent meeting on Thursday, October 3rd at 7:00 P.M. in Our Mother of Perpetual Help's Parish Hall (81 Maple St. North, New Liskeard).



EUCHARIST or communion is the opportunity to receive Jesus, the Bread of Life.

Children who have made their First Reconciliation are

invited to prepare in the winter months to receive the Body of Christ.

Preparation consists of two parent meetings, an at home parent-child workbook, participation in our weekly children's program at Saturday Evening Mass, and a retreat afternoon for candidates. The Sacrament of First Eucharist is received during the Easter Season.

All parents who wish to have their child make their First Communion this year must attend an important parent meeting on Thursday, October 3rd at 7:00 P.M. in Our Mother of Perpetual Help Parish Hall (81 Maple St. North, New Liskeard).



CONFIRMATION is

the final Sacrament of Initiation within the Church.

It is celebrated every second year with students in grade seven and eight. As we celebrated Confirmation in the spring of 2013, the next program of preparation will begin in the fall of 2014 with

the sacrament being celebrated in spring 2015 with Bishop Poitras

WHAT ABOUT YOU? NOT CATHOLIC? WANT TO LEARN MORE?

LET THE CHILDREN COME TO

ME PROGRAM We offer a children's program (for children from JK until grade three) each Saturday during our 5:00 P.M. Mass. The children are dismissed to the back of the Church just after Mass begins and return at the time of the offertory procession. During their time together they hear the gospel read at their level and work on an activity or craft based on the theme of the gospel.

PRACTICE MAKES CATHOLIC

(PMC) is an adult education initiative that is being sponsored by the Formation Team of Our Mother of Perpetual Help Parish. The series consists of five sessions **beginning Monday**, **November 11**th **at 6:00 P.M.** in the Parish Hall.

The evening begins with a simple meal and then a presentation on a topic of faith to help participants grow in their understanding and appreciation the Catholic Faith.
