There are five sub-themes for each day of Catholic Education Week:

In the afternoon we will have a bake sale. Please bring baking in support student activities.

#### Friday - Proclaiming the Good News

We will celebrate Sacred Heart Catholic School by wearing Red and White, our school colours. We will walk to St. Jerome School in the morning to participate in the Living Rosary.

This is a week specially set aside to celebrate our Catholic schools and why the triple connection of home, parish and school is an important and integral part of Catholic education and this triad, this threefold interconnection should help to emphasize for our children, our students, and the reality of our wider Catholic community.

During Education Week, it is also Mental Health week. Wooden coins will be circulated in communities across both the Cochrane and Timiskaming Districts through various community organizations.
