## Pysanka!

Staff members from the Timmins Museum came to Sacred Heart to show our Grade 4/5/6 students how to create beautiful Ukrainian Easter Eggs. The Ukrainian Egg is decorated with traditional Ukrainian folk designs using a wax-resist (batik) method. The word pysanka comes from the verb pysaty, "to write", as the designs are not painted on, but written with beeswax.
