THE MEANING OF ORDI-NARY TIME During Ordinary Time this winter, we will see how the Gospels reflect on the quest "When and how did the world first come to see that Jesus Christ is the Son of the Living God?" It seems that God willed that the truth would dawn on us slowly and that different people would have many different ways of coming to believe in Jesus. Even for us today, our faith in Christ is constantly deepening and strengthening as we recognize his gifts and power with ever-greater understanding.

THE MEANING OF LENT

Jesus said, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment.
