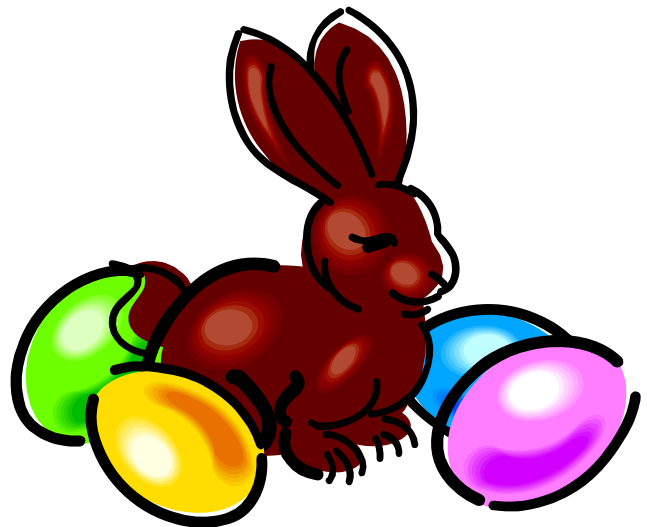
## NATIONAL POETRY MONTH
