THE MEANING OF EASTER Three days after his death on the cross, “Jesus himself stood among the disciples and said to them, ‘Peace be with you’. They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, ‘Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my

feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see” (Luke 24:36b-39a) After Jesus rose from the dead, the Bible tells us that he stayed with his friends for a little while to teach them: “Then Jesus said to them, ‘These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the

law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.’ Even with Jesus’ help, it took time for the disciples to understand what the Resurrection meant. In fact, with the help of the Holy Spirit, we are still studying and growing in our understanding of this amazing wonder, even today!
