Students are considered late when they are not present in the classroom by 8:50 am & 12:45 pm.

Each day that a child is present and on-time for school, he/she will receive a ballot towards a \$50.00 gift card that will be drawn monthly!

## Focus on Attendance & Punctuality

Regular attendance is critical to academic achievement and overall student well-being. When a student misses school or is late for class regularly, this has a direct and serious impact on learning—and it causes disruption in the classroom. We want to work with families to ensure each student is getting the most from his/her school year. **For this reason, attendance will be monitored closely and parents will be notified when attendance becomes a concern. It is the responsibility of the parent to ensure each student arrives on time and is in attendance regularly.**

## Student Update Forms



Each family should be receiving a copy of the Student Information Form by mail. Please make sure that you review the information on this form, and make any necessary changes to the information listed. This will help us ensure that we have the right information in our computer system.

This form is to be returned to the school with your child by Friday, September 21st. It is very important that we have updated contact information and a working emergency number. You will also notice a section labeled "Consent Information." Read this section carefully and indicate how you consent for each item.

If you have not received this form in the mail, or have misplaced it, please contact the school and we will send another form home with your child.

## Safe Schools Protocols

### Reporting an Absent Student

If your child is going to be absent for the day, or a portion of the day, please be sure to call the school by 9:00 am. Mrs. Cheff is required to call the parents of all absent students. A BIG thanks to those parents who do call as this saves a great deal of time for all of us!

### Changes to Transportation

If you will be picking your child up from school instead of having him/her take the bus, please call the school **by 2:30** to let us know. We are required to log how each child gets home on a daily basis. Last minute changes make this process difficult.

### Visitors to the School

Although we always welcome parents to the school, we do have a visitor's policy in effect. You must sign in at the front office and get a visitor's pass if you wish to proceed into any area of the school that has classrooms. We thank you in advance for your cooperation with this process.

# Safe Schools Protocols Continued...

## Supervision on the Playground

Please be advised that our playground is **unsupervised before 8:30**. Therefore, children are not to be dropped off at school before this time. For those children who walk to school, parents need to time their arrival so that they are not here before 8:30.

At the end of the school day, all children who walk are asked to go directly home.



## Emergency Preparedness Plan

We are required by law to have 6 fire drills and 2 lockdown drills each year. Students are

taught how to respond during these drills before any take place. Though this can seem scary to some of our children, it is a necessary part of school operations. More information regarding the lockdown process will be sent home soon.

## Pick Up & Drop Off

As you all know, parking is at a premium in the area around the school. Parking becomes a serious safety concern at arrival and dismissal times. We are asking all parents to avoid parking in the turn around area in front of the school before and after school. **The area designated as 5 minute parking does not apply to these times and are off limits.** Buses are struggling to get through and the number of vehicles using the turn around is making it dangerous out there for our children.

## The Virtues Program




