## PARENTS' CORNER WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW



### ABOUT....

#### Learning goals and success criteria

- A learning goal explains, in child-friendly language, what your child is learning. It should clearly outline what the child is learning (e.g. "We are learning to..."). Learning goals are based on curriculum expectations. We learn better when we understand why we are learning this material.
- Success criteria are the "I can" statements that specifically outline what your child will need to do to meet their learning goal. Think of it this way, the success criteria are the key steps or 'ingredients' your child needs to follow in order to meet the learning goal.
- You should expect assignments to list both the learning goal and success criteria.
