E.C.C.S. Celebrates Lent and Forgiveness!

s we begin the season of Lent, we are reminded that this special season provides all of us with a time to prepare for the essence of our faith - the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. As in previous years, our school community will begin the Liturgical Season of Lent with the distribution of ashes



on Ash Wednesday and our Lenten promises. These promises will be our focus for the forty days of Lent and will be a reminder that Lent is a time to change the things in our lives which separate us from Jesus. Some of us have chosen to give-up something like candy or TV, remembering each time we deny ourselves the huge sacrifice that Jesus made for our sins. be followed. All devices must be used responsibly and only with the permission of the classroom teacher. In addition, the school will not be responsible for lost or damaged devices!




Student Absences and Lates:
