***Our Advent Novena Prayer:** "Father, all-powerful and ever-living God, we give You thanks through Jesus Christ our Lord. When he humbled Himself to come among us as a Man, He fulfilled the plan You formed long ago and opened for us the way to salvation. Now we watch for the day when Christ our Lord will come again in His glory. His future coming was proclaimed by all the prophets. The Virgin Mother bore Him in her womb with love beyond all telling. John the Baptist was His herald and made Him known when at last He came. In His love He has filled us with joy as we prepare to celebrate His birth. When he comes, may He find us watching in prayer, our hearts filled with wonder and praise.
