We cannot express how important it is to ensure that your child attends school regularly and on time. Research has shown that students who attend less than 90% of the time have greater academic struggles, have a better chance of disengaging from school, and are at risk for not graduating. It also removes them from their social circles and it can make it challenging for them to re-integrate back with friends, particularly if they have missed school events that focus on developing social situations (activity days, etc.). It is important to note that the child who attends school every day is more likely as an adult to be at work everyday.
