OUR FOCUS AT SACRED HEART



One of the areas the staff at Sacred Heart is working on to support student learning is descriptive feedback. By providing descriptive feedback,

we are trying to encourage our students to think critically about their work. Descriptive feedback can come in many forms. It can be a comment a teacher gives to the student while they are working, it can be a written comment in the form of a "Wow!" (what you did really well) and a "Now" statement (what you need to do to improve), or it can be provided during a conference with the student, etc. The purpose of descriptive feedback is to give students the opportunity to reflect on what they have done and improve on it. This feedback should be given at the point of learning so that the child can take the information and apply it to what they are working on. Often, the feedback will provide the child with strategies to improve their work. This feedback is to be based from the success criteria provided to the children before beginning the task. Remember, learning goals tell the children what they should know and be able to do, and success criteria lists what the child needs to do in order to successfully show they have achieved the learning goal.
