It is important that our students realize they are stewards of the earth and to help them learn the importance of being 'just' to the earth, the school will be participating in **Lights Out Canada on April 22** which is Earth Day! We will be reducing our ecological impact by turning off our lights, turning off electrical components and reducing our use of energy.

SOCIAL JUSTICE

Mme. Furlott's grade 5 and 6 classes have been discussing social justice issues within the class. Both classes have decided on a project that addresses a need they see in our community. The grade six class is going to compete in a CAN'Art project where the goal is to increase awareness about hunger in our local community. The grade six students will be collecting as many canned goods as they possibly can (not boxed items) and will use these cans to build a design in a competition at the Timmins Square. These designs will be on display at the Timmins Square on April 30th from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. You are invited to go see the designs and vote on your favourite. The canned goods will be donated to the local food banks the very next day. The grade six class is asking for your help. If you

could donate any canned goods (must be cans) by April 24th, it would be greatly appreciated. The grade five class is attempting to create awareness about children who are unable to afford registration fees or equipment in order to participate in local sports due to family finances. The grade fives would like to assist KidSport, a non-profit organization that helps fund sporting activities for young children who cannot afford them. On May 1st, the grade 5 students will be holding an event for students at Sacred Heart who would like to participate in shooting a puck through a "hole" in the next. If they are successful at putting the puck in the net, their name will be put in a draw for a prize. Should your child want to participate, they are asked to bring in \$1.00 for each puck they wish to shoot. All money raised will be donated to KidSport.
