WHAT WE ARE WORKING ON AT SACRED HEART SCHOOL

In the last newsletter, we introduced you to some new terminology: <u>learning goals</u> and <u>success criteria</u>. Learning goals tell the children what they should



know and be able to do, and success criteria lists what the child needs to do in order to successfully show they have achieved the learning goal. Assessment is directly tied to learning goals and success criteria. We are working towards refining our assessment practices to better support student learning. Our main focus for assessment is to try and inform students, and parents, that assessment is about improving student learning through their work. By providing feedback to children on what they did well, what they did poorly and what they need to do next time, students' learning should improve. We need to instill the idea, and practice, that it is "not o.k." to do something to "get it done", only our best will do! As parents, you could ask your child specific questions about what they are learning, why this is important to learn, what they did well, and what they could do next time to improve, etc.
