Dressing for the cold weather:

A reminder that students should come to school prepared to play outside in snowy and cold weather. A hat, mitts, snow pants and boots are required for all students who wish to play in the snow. Should the temperature fall below - 25 and depending on the wind chill, students will remain inside for an indoor
