# Work from March and for April

#### French Immersion

Mr. Moore JK/SK

The children have been doing patterns in Math and will begin Measurement. In Social Studies they are learning about emotions and the emphasis in Science is recycling.

#### Mme Whissell 1-2

Students will write poetry for Easter. In Math, they will continue to do addition and subtraction -gr. 1's using numbers to 12, gr. 2's using 2-digit numbers with no regrouping.

#### Mme Moore 3-4

Students are studying Medieval Times in Social Studies and Pulleys and Gears in Science. They will do interviewing in French.

#### Mme Archambault 5-6, 7-8

In Language, poetry will be written for Easter.

### **April Virtue of Justice**

April, with its celebration of Easter, has been assigned the virtue of JUSTICE. At this time we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus who is the Just One who died for the sake of the unjust, that He might lead people back to God. But justice is also an important part of Catholic teaching beyond Christ's Death and Resurrection. The need to do justice comes from the obligation to respect the dignity of every human person. This dignity comes from being created in God's image. Failing to respect human dignity, including failing to do justice, is a failure to respect the image of God in others. As in this month's quote, "Let justice flow like a stream, and righteousness like a river that never goes dry." Amos 5:24, Saint Anne School will be working towards justice on the playground, in the classroom, at sports events, and at home. Justice means that we deal fairly with others, recognizing the equality and dignity of all. It requires that we work to insure that all people, especially the poor and the weak, have access to opportunities. It assumes that none of us is free until all of us are. One of the central tenants of Catholic social teaching is the dignity of the human being; we are all created in the image of God, and therein rests our inalienable dignity. Doing justice is a central imperative in all major religions. This virtue applies to the whole range of human interactions, and today it is also being extended to animals, the environment, indeed, the whole universe.






The Tree of Forgiveness

The Great Big Crunch took place on March 10<sup>th</sup> at 2:30 p.m. so we joined people across Canada in biting into an apple - a healthy snack.






Mr. Pajunen presented all of the grades 5 and 6 students their own copy of the Scriptures (Psalms and New Testament) from of the Gideons.


