MEAN MOMENT:

- Someone is being hurt on purpose
- Reaction to a strong feeling or emotion
- An isolated event (does not happen regularly)

BULLYING:

- Attacked physically, socially and/or emotionally
- Unequal balance of power
- Happens more than once over a period of time
- Someone is being mean on purpose

Virtue of the Month: LOVE

Faith, Hope and Love are the three theological virtues, and are the foundation of moral activity. Love is superior to all of these virtues. It also draws us closer to God and closer to one another. In order to better understand love, we need to reflect on God's love for man. We see God's love for us as being both selfless and sacrificial. The greatest demonstration of these two attributes is evident in the passion of Christ. Before his death, Jesus informs us of his wishes: "My commandment is this: love one another, just as I love you" (John 15:13). Jesus loved His disciples and humanity to the end. Love motivates the Christian to do what is right in order to bring about the happiness of God and neighbor. Love is God's gift to us in Baptism. Our model of love is Jesus. Looks like: serving others, lending a helping hand, sacramental engagement, opening a door for someone, allowing others to go before us, taking care of what belongs to others, helping others in need, praying for our loved ones and for our enemies. Sounds like: prayer, encouraging someone, complimenting each other, listening to other people's ideas, treating people the way we would like to be treated. Feels like: Welcoming others, helping others with their feelings, understanding each other, including others, feels like Jesus bringing a cool drink of water on a hot day. 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School safety reminders and volunteers

Parents & Visitors must sign in:

Parents are welcomed to the school throughout the year, however, for the safety of our staff and students, parents and visitors must use only the front door for entry and need to sign in at the office.

As part of our commitment to ensuring student safety, the doors remain locked during the school day; visitors need to be buzzed in with our buzzer system and report to the front office. Visitors are not entitled to go to the classrooms as this is a disruption to student programming.

If you need to go to the classroom, arrangements can be made in advance with your child's classroom teacher. Parent messages and deliveries (keys, lunches, etc.) are handled through the office. Student lunches can be left on the shelf outside the front office. Don't forget to label your child's lunch.
