Lent Wednesday, February 17 to Thursday, April 1

THE MEANING OF LENT Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the laws of the prophets" (Matthew 22:37b–40). Lent is the time we try with all our hearts to turn back to God. That turning back is called repenting (turning again). After a time of distraction or willful turning away we feel great sorrow that we have neglected or damaged our relationship with God and we do penance. Repentance and penance are two import ant works of Lent.
