The Importance of Justice:

Justice is a cardinal virtue found in the character of persons who show a practiced determination to live in right relationship with God and neighbor and to seek that, is just in every situation. Justice is about reaching out so that others are treated with equal dignity as God's children. Justice is living with righteousness. Justice is visible in our Catholic schools whenever we see people striving to meet their obligations to God and neighbor both near and far away.

“Let justice flow like waters, and righteousness like an ever flowing stream.” Amos 5:24

1. The first step to achieving justice is to do what is right and stand up for what we know God wants.
2. Let your actions be guided by the idea that even in the face of injustice (death on the cross) Jesus always acted with dignity.
3. Everyone wants to be treated fairly; we need to remember to treat others fairly.
4. Remember that Jesus was always an instrument for justice in his work with people.

The Ministry, the various boards of education, and the schools use the results to determine the state of education in the province and develop plans for improvement.
